Disabled are a higher risk to be victims of crime

People with developmental disabilities are 4 to 10 times more likely to be victims of crime than other people are.

More than half of all abuse of people with disabilities is estimated to be perpetrated by family members and peers with disabilities. Disability professionals (i.e., paid or unpaid caregivers, doctors and nurses.) are generally believed responsible for the other half. In addition, approximately 67 percent of perpetrators who abused individuals with severe cognitive disabilities accessed them through their work in disability services.

Woman with disabilities reported experiencing abuse for longer periods of time than woman without disabilities: a collective difference of 3.9years vs. 2.5 years. Also, the types of abuse experienced by the woman with disabilities specifically reported that their abusers sometimes withheld wheelchairs, braces, medications, and denied them transportation or assistance with personal tasks.
